



## PERMISSION TO TAKE CREDIT BY EXAM (CBE)

**Responsible**: Office of Academics, Department of Assessment

#### **PURPOSE**

This Administrative Form is required of students interested in pursuing a Credit by Exam.

### **PROCEDURE**

- 1. Counselors must complete this form verifying student eligibility to take a Credit by Exam (CBE) prior to the student taking a CBE.
- 2. Students must present the completed form to the test administrator proctoring the CBE in order to participate. Students testing at the Department of Extended Studies must present the completed form at the time of registration to take a CBE.
- 3. Permission to take a CBE may be granted after the student's counselor verifies:
  1) the student has not earned credit in the course, 2) the student meets the full academic load requirement without the CBE, 3) the student has not exceeded the two attempts limit for the exam, and 4) if the CBE is in mathematics or science, the student has taken the required number of courses and, *if applicable*, passed the required assessment for graduation in that subject area.

Example: For a student seeking permission to take the Algebra 1 S1 CBE, answer yes to all of the following:

- Student has not earned credit in Algebra 1 S1.
- Student has not taken and failed Algebra 1 S1.
- Student is a Senior and is taking 5 courses which meets the academic load requirement for Seniors.
- Student has taken 3 courses in mathematics while in high school.
- Student has passed the required graduation assessment for mathematics.

### 4. Qualifications

- a. CBE is only offered to students enrolled in a Washoe County School District (District) high school.
- b. Student is not currently enrolled in the course.
- c. If the student has already earned credit in the course, CBE is not an option.

- d. If the student has taken a course and failed it, CBE is not an option.
- e. CBE may not be counted toward the minimum load requirement.
- f. Students may not take a CBE in mathematics or science, prior to meeting two criteria:
  - i. Taking the number of required courses for graduation while in high school (3-math, 2-science); and
  - ii. Passing all of the required assessments for graduation for each course in that subject area (if applicable). Example: If a student has attempted two courses in science and has passed the required assessment for graduation in science, the student would be eligible to take a science course CBE.
- g. Students may only take any course or language CBE once in a semester and a total of two times in their high school career.
- h. Students who fail a CBE must take the entire CBE (retest), not just the portion they failed, on all additional CBE attempts.
